Winter Quarter 2014–15

Weeks 1–4: God Sends His Son

This Christmas theme includes Bible stories about the angel telling Mary the news that she would be the mother of God's Son, the birth of baby Jesus, the angel's message to the shepherds, and the shepherds' visit to the manger. Your child will learn that God chose Mary to be the mother of His Son, that Jesus is God's Son, and that angels told about the birth of Jesus. Your child will realize that he, too, can tell others about Jesus.

Weeks 5–13: David Pleases God

Nine stories from the life of young David will illustrate ways to please God. We will repeatedly emphasize the basic truths of helping and obeying and will give your child an opportunity to practice these behaviors. (The stories are not used in strict chronological order. God's choosing David to be king is the last story rather than the first one so the children will not get David confused with King Saul.)
