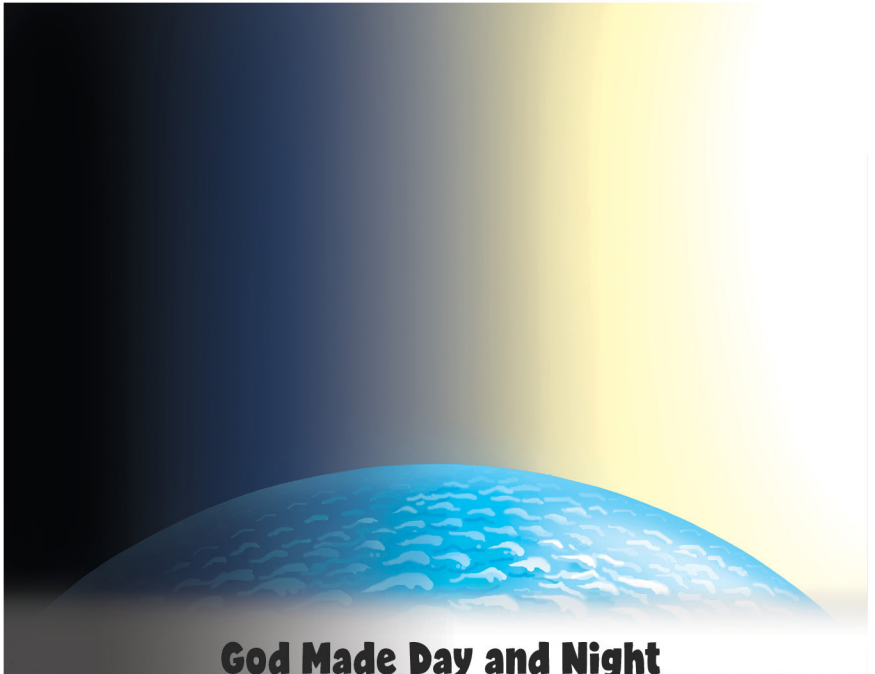

Weeks 1–8: God Created the World

Learning about the account of creation in Genesis, children will discover that God made day and night; sky and land; things that grow; the sun, moon, and stars; seasons for His world; and living creatures, including fish and birds, animals, and people. Children will realize the greatness and power of God in creation and will be glad for everything God made.

Weeks 9–13: God Provided for Adam

Genesis 2:15–17; 3:1–24
