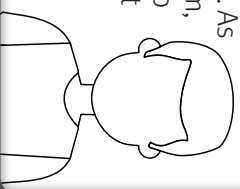

Rahab told Israel's spies that Jericho was worried about facing God. Draw the face of a resident of Jericho who is scared to face Israel's God.

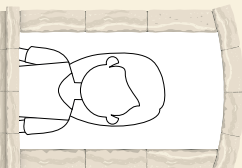
Jericho's people believed God is mighty. God is still mighty today. As you serve Him, expect Him to use His might to give you strength and courage!

My Time in God's Word

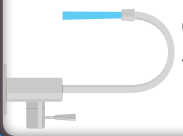
Read Joshua 3:14–17.
