2s & 3s Lesson Truths

Spring 2025

Weeks 1–4: God Protected

Three stories in this unit deal with baby Moses: his family, his mother's loving care in making the basket-bed for him, and the princess's care of him. The final lesson in the unit is about grown-up Moses leading God's people. We will emphasize God's care for us and the truth that He is with us wherever we go.

Weeks 5 and 6: God Provided

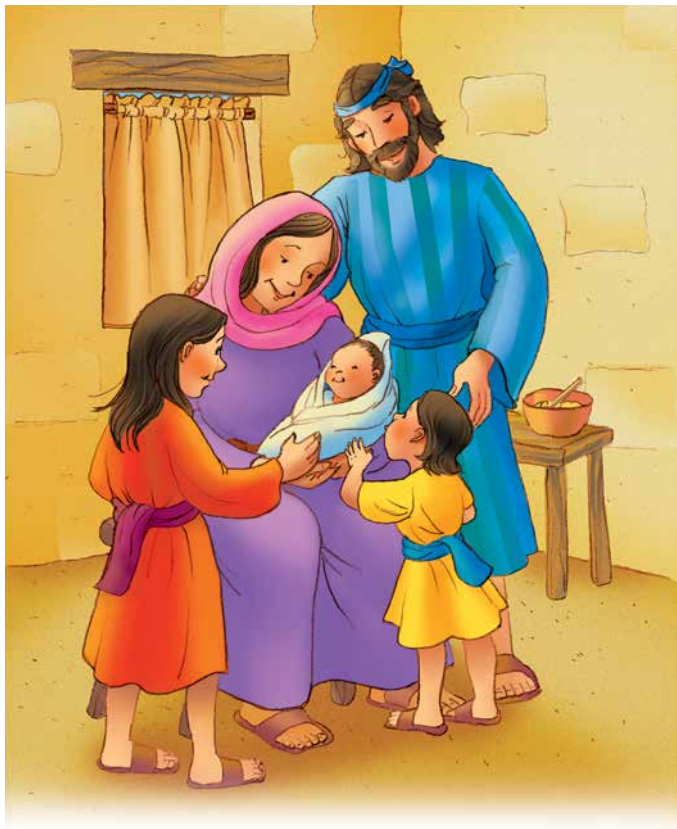
This unit focuses on two Bible stories from the time of Elisha: the oil provided for a poor widow and the room made for Elisha. Your child will learn that God gives us what we need.

Weeks 7–11: God Loved

The Bible stories for this unit include Jesus' triumphal entry, resurrection, two post-resurrection appearances, and ascension. Your child will realize that Jesus loves us, that Jesus is living, and that Jesus is in Heaven today.

Weeks 12 and 13: God Cared

From the lessons on Captain Naaman's sickness and healing, your child will learn that God cares for us and helps us when we are sick.
