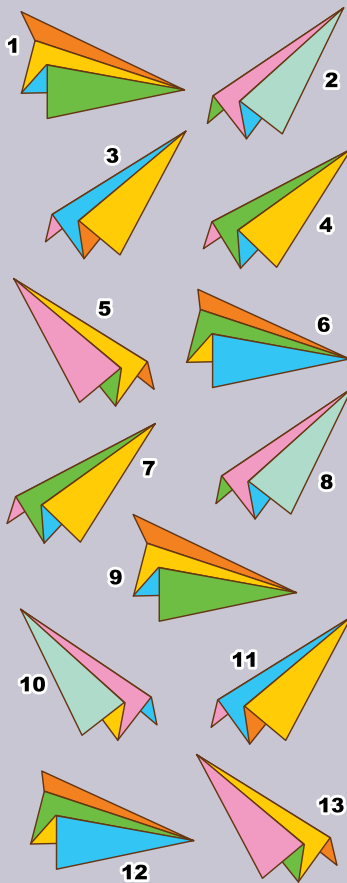
Study the picture. Try to remember details. Fold the picture back and answer the questions about the picture without looking back at it.

The longer you studied the more you remembered. Don't forget to spend time reading the Bible. The more you study it, the more you remember it!

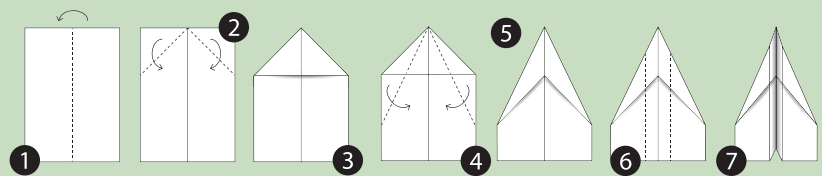
## Twinless Airplane
