## Notes to the Teacher

1. Remove the letter to parents from the front of each student book and sign each letter. Distribute the letter to the parents of each child in your class on or before the first Sunday of the quarter.
2. In preparation for the quarter, you may want to take apart all the student books and cut around the stickers. Put all the lesson 1 sheets and stickers in a folder; put all the lesson 2 sheets and stickers in another folder; continue for all thirteen lessons. This will save you time during the week.
3. If a child is absent, be sure to give that child the student book sheet (and any stickers or additional pieces) and take-home card the week following the absence.

## Using the Student Book Sheets

This student book will help you review with the children the Bible lessons and memory verses. As the children work on their sheets, talk with them about the pictures. After printing a child's name on the paper, have that child repeat the Bible verse with you.

## **T**hank you for giving us the opportunity to teach your child!

This quarter we will share with your child four exciting themes: "God Protected," "God Provided," "God Loved," and "God Cared." Your child will learn that God protected Moses (even as a baby), that Jesus rose from the dead and is living in Heaven today, and that God provides and cares for us.

### **Learning Truth at Home**

The lesson truths and Bible verses for this quarter are on the back of this page. Place the page where you will see it often. Use the Bible verses in informal conversations with your child to help your child realize that God's Word is for everyday living—not just for Sunday.

The student book sheet your child brings home each week is another opportunity to teach the Bible lesson. Use the suggestions on the back to reinforce Bible truths. Put the page on the refrigerator so your child is reminded of the story throughout the week.

### **News for You**

The unit on Jesus' love deals with events in the last week of Jesus' earthly life. It's hard for little children to understand Jesus' death, because they know so little about death. But it's even harder for adults to understand Jesus' death when they realize what it means: the sinless Son of God died for sinful people. Jesus died and rose again to be our Savior. # Lesson Truths

## Weeks 1–4

### God Protected

The lessons in this unit deal with Moses: his family, his mother's loving care in making the basket-bed, the princess's care, and grown-up Moses leading God's people. Your child will learn that God cares for us and is with us everywhere.

## Weeks 5 and 6

### God Provided

This unit focuses on two Bible stories from the time of Elisha: oil provided for a poor widow and a room made for Elisha. Your child will learn that God gives us what we need, including our homes.

## Weeks 7–11

### God Loved

The Bible stories for this unit include Jesus' triumphal entry, His resurrection, two post-resurrection appearances, and His ascension. Your child will realize that Jesus loves us, that Jesus is living, and that Jesus is in Heaven today.

## Weeks 12 and 13

### God Cared

From the lessons on Captain Naaman's sickness, your child will learn that God cares for us and helps us when we're sick.
